

Our first anthem this morning, "Jesus, Creator of the World," was composed by our Assistant Organist for the past three years, Tom Mueller. It was originally written in 2013 for the Notre Dame Liturgical Choir in celebration of the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Basilica of the Sacred Heart on the Notre Dame University campus.
