About Today's Anthem

The first anthem this morning at 10:45 is a striking interpretation/paraphrase of Psalm 23 by multiple-Grammy-award-winning artist Bobby McFerrin. Mr. McFerrin has been extremely successful in the realms of both jazz and classical music, and has been known especially for his explorations of the possibilities of the voice. In many of his albums, he has explored the sacred roots of vocal music. In this piece, dedicated to his mother, he subtly, but directly, makes a shift in the textual imagery and invites us to examine our own perceptions of the Divine. The musical style is not unlike that of Anglican Chant - a form of psalm singing which the choir has spent a great deal of time exploring in preparation for its two recent tours abroad. In its presentation, the music is somewhat "objective," and lets the text speak clearly for itself.
