

About Today's Organ Music

"Le Banquet Céleste," written by Olivier Messiaen in 1928, depicts a mystical vision of Holy Communion as a heavenly banquet. Messiaen was one of the most original of the 20th century French organist-composers. A devout Roman Catholic, his compositions were frequently on religious, even mystical themes – evoking images of heaven and creating the sense of a suspension of time. As postlude, Johann Sebastian Bach's prelude on the chorale, "Wir glauben all an einen Gott" presents a sturdy affirmation of our belief in one God.
