Children and Worship: Today we offer quiet activities for school aged children up to third grade during worship in the sanctuary. There is a table and chairs on a rug under the Arnold Park balcony where children will have the opportunity to read books and do activities that relate to our scriptures for the day.

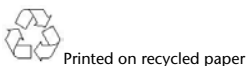
