Hymnals and Bibles are located in the pew racks. **Church School** is available for children, preschool through sixth grade, during the 10:45am worship service. The 4th grade class will be in worship today.

Child Care is available all morning in the Education Building for infants, toddlers and pre-schoolers.

Pastoral Care needs and prayer concerns may be communicated to Martha Langford.


More about Membership: If you are interested in joining Third Church, or just want to know more, contact Lynette Sparks. The next Exploring Membership luncheon will take place today at noon.






